What is Title I?


City Park Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop, with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how City Park Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. City Park Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that City Park Elementary will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



How is it revised?

City Park Elementary invites all parents to attend our annual Title I Meeting in October to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through written form turned in to the main office. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. Parents and family members can also give feedback during PTO meetings, Family Nights, and School Council meetings during the school year including our annual PTO Open House.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. City Park Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

Parents are given opportunities during PTO meetings, Family Nights, and School Council meetings to view the policy. The plan is also posted on the school website and social media. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan from the main office.



2018–19 District Goals

By 2019, Dalton Public School students will meet or exceed the state target cohort graduation rate for all students. By 2019, Dalton Public School students will be reading at or above grade level as measured by the EOG. By 2019, Dalton Public School students will meet or exceed the state performance target in Reading on the EOG. By 2019, Dalton Public School students will meet or exceed the state performance target in Math on the EOG. Educate all students in learning environments that are safe, drug free, and conducive to learning.

2018–19 School Goals

By 2018, City Park Elementary School students will meet or exceed the state performance target in Reading, ELA, and Math. In addition, student scores will increase in Writing, Science, and Social Studies.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, City Park Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the

Community Cares event and the School Forum. The school-parent compacts also are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences and kept with each child's teacher if parents need another copy.

City Park Elementary will host the following events to build the capacity for strong family engagement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. Times for all meetings for parents and family members are listed below.

School Council – August 28, 2018 at 5:30 pm

A forum for parents and family members to participate in roundtable discussions with the principal and staff regarding the school wide plan, parent and family engagement policy, school-parent compacts, and the family engagement budget.

Annual Title I Meeting – October 29 , 2018 at 4:30 pm

We invite you to a meeting of learning and sharing about our Title I program, including our parent and family engagement policy, the school wide plan, the school-parent compacts, and parents' requirements. Invitations will posted in the school newsletter, front door, and social media.

PTO/Open House – August 30, 2018 at 4:30 pm/5:30 pm

Learn about the City Park PTO; meet your child's teacher, and our friendly and helpful school staff.

Parent-Teacher and Student Conferences – minimum of two throughout the year

Scheduled updates on your child's progress.

Family Literacy Night – TBD (due to construction)

Each student will select a book to take home and read with his or her parents and family members. Students and parents will move around to different literacy based stations throughout the school.

School Council – November 7, 2017, February 6, 2018, and May 15, 2018 at 5:30 p.m.

A forum for parents and family members to participate in roundtable discussions with the principal and staff.

Family Math Night – TBD (due to construction)

Come participate in math activities with your child. Each family will receive math resources to use at home to reinforce your child's learning.

Spring PTO Meeting – TBD (due to construction)

Review the City Park PTO work from the past year, and look ahead at the proposed budget and PTO officers for the next school year.

Family Science Night – TBD (due to construction)

Come participate in science activities with your child. Each child will bring home items from visited stations and experiments.






Parent and Family Engagement

City Park Elementary is Branching Out!

City Park Elementary will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish, posted on the school website, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families
- ✓ Provide trainings for staff on strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during meetings
- ✓ Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs (as applicable) to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning
- ✓ Share information in English and Spanish in the school newsletter for parents to understand the school's academic standards and assessments as well as the ways parents can monitor their child's progress and work with educators
- ✓ Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding schoolwide events and activities, through phone messages, social media, and flyers
- ✓ Work with our parents to develop relevant trainings and helpful presentations to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning
- ✓ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement
- ✓ Use our Partners in Education and School Council to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parent and family engagement policy
- ✓ Work with the district to offer literacy and computer classes for parents and family members to help further enhance their various educational levels
- ✓ Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events and post a suggestion form on the school website in order to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities
